Attention Students:

Think you don't qualify for SNAP? Think again!

If you're enrolled **AT LEAST HALF TIME** in a college or university, or in a business, technical, trade, or vocational school that requires a high school diploma, you may qualify for food stamps if you:

- Are under 18 or over 49 years of age **-OR-**
- Are employed at least 20 hours a week **-OR-**
- Are physically or mentally unfit to work **-OR-**
- Are responsible for a child under 12 years old **-OR-**
- Receive Ohio Works First benefits **-OR-**
- Participate in a work study or on-the-job training program **-OR-**
- Are assigned to school through an employment and training program

**Even if you meet only one of the above criteria,
other rules and exceptions may apply.**

If you're enrolled **LESS THAN HALF TIME** in a college or university, or in a business, technical, trade, or vocational school that requires a high school diploma, you may qualify for more than 3 months* of food stamps if you:

- Are under 18 or over 49 years of age **-OR-**
- Are physically or mentally unfit to work, or are pregnant **-OR-**
- Live with someone under 18 **-OR-**
- Receive OWF, unemployment compensation, private disability payments, SSDI or SSI **-OR-**
- Have applied for unemployment compensation or SSI **-OR-**
- Live with or are responsible for someone who is incapacitated or is under 6 years of age **-OR-**
- Regularly participate in a drug or alcohol treatment or rehab program **-OR-**
- Participate in a county work program at least 20 hours a week **-OR-**
- Work for pay/or in exchange for goods or services, at least 20 hours per week **-OR-**
- Participate in a work experience program (WEP) at a county WEP site.

**Even if you meet only one of the above criteria,
other rules and exceptions may apply.**

**NOTE: As of October 1, 2018, residents of 38 counties including Cuyahoga, Lorain, and Ashtabula do not have to meet any of the above criteria in order to qualify for more than 3 months of food stamps. These exceptions are subject to change every year.*

While the Federal Public Health Emergency Declaration remains in effect:

If you have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of \$0 on your most recent FAFSA, or if you are eligible for work study, even if you are not participating, you may be eligible for \$234 per month or more in SNAP!
